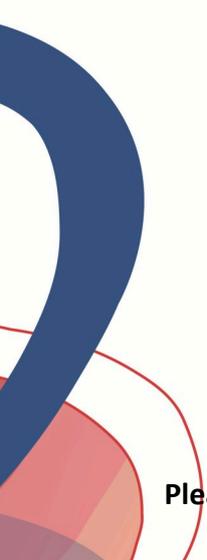



Vision: A community of connected voices achieving positive change.






What Next?
